COMMUNITY

- Children develop a sense of belonging to groups and communities and an understanding of the reciprocal rights and responsibilities necessary for active community participation
- Children respond to diversity with respect
- Children become aware of fairness Children become socially responsible and show respect for the environment

Children develop dispositions for learning such as curiosity, cooperation, confidence, creativity, commitment, enthusiasm, persistence, imagination and reflexivity

- Children develop arange of skills and processes such as problem solving inquiry, experimentation, hypothesizing, researching and investigating
